

Mike has been a physical Therapist since 1991 and a Clinical Specialist in Neurologic Physical Therapy since 1995. He is the only therapist in the nation to be awarded the Clinician of the Year by two different national academies of the American Physical Therapy Association, being awarded the Clinical Excellence Award in both Neurology and Geriatrics.

He has authored over 30 journal articles and contributed-to or primary authored 6 book chapters.

He is a recognized national and international speaker on topics including aging, stroke, motor learning, motivation in rehabilitation, cognition, balance, dizziness, and Parkinson's Disease, having presented in 48 states and 9 countries. In 2020, Mike presented a TED talk on neuroplasticity that has been viewed by thousands, and he was designated with the highest honor that can be bestowed on a physical therapist – a Fellow of the American Physical Therapy Association for lifetime and diverse contributions to the profession in clinical, research and educational fields.



Owner, Lead Therapist Northwest Rehab Associates Oregon



- Mitigated with early adoption of telehealth and home visits
- Policies and procedures for social distancing and rigorous cleaning. Rearranged staffing to adjust volume of therapists for time of day and days of the week, repositioned equipment, cleared waiting room chairs, patients waiting primarily in cars until appointment time, caregivers/drivers waiting in cars, cleaning every surface after every patient contact.
- Staff wears masks

- YouTube video explaining our stance, precautions, and which patients were deemed essential. Excellent receptivity from staff and community alike.
- Stayed "ahead of the curve":

- Immediate patient volume drop of 70%
 - ➤ Laid off 8 employees / 1 PT
 - > Reduction of schedule hours
 - Decreased employee hours mitigated with Workshare
- Telehealth and limited in clinic visits
- New goals and metrics for leadership, PTs and admin staff



KELLY DELLAPIANO BS, PTA



Director of Operations Rehabilitation Associates, Inc.



- Patient volume decline beginning mid-March, static volume through April, referrals increasing in May
- "Every person's feelings, fears and reactions to the pandemic were all different"
- Mitigation:
 - > Telehealth, Split staff into teams, Patient screening
 - > Temperature checks for patients and staff
 - > PPE, hand sanitizer
 - > Communication
